- Describe The Event
 - Noche Latina is an annual event that bestows the honor of Mr. and Miss Latino/a Penn State on two students. The winners also receive an educational scholarship for the following academic year. Eligible candidates must be enrolled at Penn State, University Park for the following academic year in order to fulfill the following responsibilities: participation in the Homecoming Parade, completion of thirty hours of community service, and having hosted an educational program for the student-body. Finally, the winners are encouraged to maintain visibility in the community, positively representing Latinos wherever they go.
 - O All applicants must fulfill a certain grade point average and interview with the Noche Latina committee to demonstrate how their involvement as a Latinx on campus has impacted our Penn State Community. Upon acceptance as a running candidate, one must begin preparations for the event.
 - o The night starts off with the cultural segment. The segment consists of a pre-recorded video introducing themselves and their nationality, the Latino Caucus dance team, and the candidates wearing traditional attire from their nationality. Next is the monologues. Typically, the committee poses an overarching question or theme in which candidates' monologues are framed around. Following the monologues, the candidates perform a personal talent to the audience and judges. Lastly, they answer questions in relations to culture, politics, and social issues affecting the Latinos in the United States.
 - O The program concludes with the judges, which range from diverse departments of faculty, tally up the points and choose our next Mr. and Miss Latino/a Penn State. This year, Noche Latina is set for Thursday, April 20th, 2017 and will begin promptly at 6:00pm with doors opening at 5:30pm. Along with the various performances by the candidates, the event will include additional performances by students and/or organizations. Lastly, Latino Caucus awards certificates to outstanding students and student organizations, who have exemplified leadership throughout the 2016-2017 school year.
- History of Event
 - O This year marks the 22nd year of Noche Latina on the Penn State campus. Noche Latina is a hotly anticipated event due, in part, to its inspiring contestants and lively performances. Historically, the event fills to capacity and attracts considerable media attention.
- How will this event benefit on campus students?

- O Noche Latina is an event that promotes diversity and recognition in the Penn State community. Traditionally, the lionshare of students who apply (and go on to win) are oncampus students during their first or second year on campus. This event serves as a way to recognize these students, empower them to continue their involvement, and bring a marginalized group to the forefront. All too often, Penn State students are not given the opportunity outside of the classroom to learn about the different cultures that make up our student-body. Noche Latina aims to connect the entire Penn State community to learn more about the Latino culture. That being said, the event is open to everyone. In fact, we encourage everyone to grab tickets as soon as possible because it tends to fill rapidly. While this event is not directly involved in the All In campaign, we see ourselves as fulfilling the promise of diversity and inclusion by extending a long-standing traditional event to oncampus students. If ARHS opts to fund our event, you would be enabling us to encourage and recognize budding students leaders.

- How will this funding be used?
 - o This funding will be used towards the catering and scholarships. To cover catering alone, we would have to charge each student \$25 for the event. This is not feasible for most students, or at the very least, would deter many from participating. The funding would be used to operate more comfortably with the general budget, provide a quality experience, and offer it at a reasonable cost (~\$3).
