• Thank you for your leadership, what I do really comes from you all as student leaders on campus.



- Penn State as compared to other universities, we really should be proud of our housing here as we do
 really well even compared to other big 10 schools. Please continue to give us feedback! We really
 strive to keep improving. As you can see with our larger construction projects and our smaller
 enhancements.
- It is unfortunate that many or most of you won't see the changes unless you come back as Alumni
- We have a support group for many different services including several new dieticians and nutritionists and more experienced ones. We want them to engage with both those who require it and the campus at large.
- Nathaniel: Coffee on campus! The reasoning behind it being non-competition between residence halls and hub Starbucks coffee
 - First, one of the things as we look at all the different types of beverages on campus, so they
 can get what they're looking for on campus. We know there's a demand and sometimes the
 lines can be unwieldy. We looked at that to see if we can bring Starbucks close to the
 residents to better the rush
 - Secondly, Edge really grew in popularity in east, we looked at pollock and had to ask whether the demand would transfer over to pollock.
 - The discount has been taken away, we looked at the sourcing at the particular bean, the
 product we were serving cost more than Starbucks, so we reduced it to the Starbucks prices.
 When we changed to the Starbucks beans it also increased the price due to the coffee costs,
 likely we hadn't actually looked at the price-cost evaluation when Edge started using the
 Irving's beans
- Evan: So the Seattle's Best is no longer served on campus?
 - Irvings is found at the two Edge locations, Starbucks is served in all of the locations including all you can eat
- Daniel: Removal of trash rooms in Pollock and across campus?
 - At all of the commonwealth campuses students take out their own trash, so we are piloting this now at the main campus
 - Daniel: I think it is likely causing students to be more wasteful and is causing many repeated residences to be angry with the removal of a service.
 - That is some good feedback that I can bring back.
 - Chris: I feel like the removal of trash rooms is also prohibitive to students with disabilities and physical limitations
 - Definitely true and good feedback
 - Evan: Is there any survey or means of contact for students to inform you of issues?
 - Not specifically
 - Nathaniel: Push towards standardization in residential dining, the mix and match are now being removed, how do you see the standardization versus the removal of choices?
 - o It's both an art and a science, what are you eating, when are you eating, where are you eating. We can now see what's selling and we have a little more business savvy and regulation in the ordering systems. It's one of the things that we looked at, we'd see that we would have a great item at one location but no others. We can see there are certain types of grilled cheese for example that people order most and we're looking to get more time in your schedule. We're looking to get the best of the best, and that can't always satisfy everyone and shift some of those rarer items to the specialty items. We need to see not just at the UP campus but also at all the commonwealth, CPI or PPI standards based on the inflation regarding food. We look at the future forecasting in those standards so that we can keep the meal plan rates from climbing as at other schools it is happening much more regularly. The other thing is the reduction of food waste, where we would add in more things based off of student requests but they would expire with next to no purchases, so we try to fit the demand rather than meet every demand
 - o Rolling Lion outside Willard Building, It was some of the best reception we've ever had for them. It was originally at Behrend but was moved here due to the weather issues. We've had it in the homecoming parade, as part of nittanyville, football games, IFC tailgate, Pollock.

- We're leveraging it as we get different requests, we're trying to have it out and about multiple days a week.
- Did anyone try the pop-up? (MJ did) we probably could be doing more to advertise things.
 Likely no one has heard the Chef Demo happening next week
- Evan: Foodservice employees, not having enough?
- We as a country have a very low unemployment rate, so now we are working to adapt our marketing for jobs as a whole, where are the gaps in our messaging, do the people working for us to see it? Do the students not working for us see any? We want to expose more students to more opportunities, can we become more creative with our scheduling, exposing students to more locations. We're looking to change that dynamic.
