#### Guest of the Week

- Charima Young, Director of Local Government & Community Relations
  - Mark Rameker: Would it be okay to share something you are working on?
  - Charima: I'll use Greek Life as an example. When the university decided to put out a list of reforms, there was a response team developed. There was a leadership & advisory group put together. Some student greek life leaders were on that board, as well as people from the burough. So we're working together with Greek Life, the Highlands Association and the school to make things work. What's working? What's not? Have there been improvements? What I do is go to their meetings, listen, craft ideas to fix things, etc. I'm the one that hears people when they don't hear each other. And I encourage you to develop that skill. Most people see things black and white, and in order to foster collaboration you have to be able to see in the gray.

## **Open Student Forum**

- Sheritha McLean, Black Student Union
  - Kayla: So you asked for \$1,000 to \$2,500. Can you elaborate more on the range?
  - Sheritha: We picked that range because our expenses weren't totalled yet. We know especially for UPAC they don't really give an all inclusive amount. So we have been working on fundraising events on our own but need assistance in covering some expenses. Based on UPAC, 50% is usually covered.
  - Laekin: Is there a ticket cost?



- Sheritha: Yes, \$15 for students. \$8 for due paying members. \$20 for Staff or those who don't attend Penn State. \$120 for buying a table.
- Cheyenne: How many people usually attend?
- Sheritha: Around 220 attendees, but we keep growing every year. We're expecting 250 this year. As our attendees increase, so does our budget.
- Laekin: Do you know how much UPAC funding you're going to receive?
- $\circ$  Sheritha: I would think about \$23,000 or \$24,000. Which leaves us about half to fund on our own with other sponsors.
